What is the role of a Recruitment Coordinator?

To oversee the end to end recruitment for temporary staff who help us deliver to parents, children and schools. I select and appoint suitable staff. This involves sourcing suitable candidates, conducting interviews, completing necessary background checks

What skills and knowledge do you need in your role as a Recruitment Coordinator?

To be well organised and to have excellent attention to detail. As the role involves liaising with a lot of people on a day to day basis, its key to be a confident communicator, both written and verbally. The ability to work under pressure and meet deadlines is also crucial!

What are looking for within job applications?

Knowledge or experience is typically one of the first things we look out for when we assess potential candidates. Another factor that we consider is looking for the good interpersonal skills suited to the role and being able to relate to our core mission.

What advice would you tell young people looking for jobs?
